	D First aid kit easily seen (10 points)
	E Fire attended or out, cold to touch (10 points)
	F Fire located in proper area (in relation to the kitchen, tents, etc.)

	G Fuels properly stored (in closed containers, away from fires, etc.) (10 points)
	H Food properly stored (10 points)
IV.	Menu planning, Duty Roster
