	At check-in, you will be asked to provide:				
	 The Unit Attendance Form (attached to this Informational Packet) with the names of all Scouts and adults planning to participate in the program and your patrols. All medical forms for each Scout must be kept on-site, secure, and accessible. A list and time of visitors (non-Scouters) attending camp. The time you plan to check out so we can inspect your camp. 				
	Once you have been checked-in, a camp host will take you to your designated camping area.				
	Every effort will be made to assign your unit to a campsite appropriate for the size of your unit. We ask that you set up your campsite in the				

area designated for you and that you respect those areas marked as restricted. We have planned the locations of our program areas to

minimize the amount of traffic through your camping areas and to avoid having distractions too near to the program areas.

Meals Bring your own food and cooking equipment for all meals. Please, no ground fires or Dutch Ovens. Dutch Ovens may be used only in the parking lot as marked on the Camp Map. Water is available next to and around Swanson Lodge. Bring a no-cook bag lunch for Saturday because you might have to eat it on the bus during the trip to the train station.

Bus to TrainYou will be given wrist band when you check in at camp. Put the wristStation andband on immediately. If the band is not on your wrist, you will not be
allowed on the bus. If you are not on the bus you will not be going on
the train. You must take the bus to the train station and museum.

Wrist bands will be provided and found inside the check-in packet when you arrive at camporee.

You must be at the bus by the departure time or you might lose your spot on the bus.

The bus ride to the train station and museum will take approximately 25 minutes. Prior to the training departing the station, you will have approximately 30 to 60 minutes to walk through the museum.

Train Ride	The Osceola & St Croix Valley Railway is a <u>heritage railroad</u> in <u>Osceola, Wisconsin</u> , owned jointly by the Osceola Historical Society and the <u>Minnesota Transportation Museum</u> . It operates on former <u>Soo Line</u> and <u>Wisconsin Central</u> trackage (now owned by the <u>Canadian National Railway</u>).				
	Originally operating out of Stillwater, Minnesota, the railway moved to Osceola in 1992, beginning operations in the St. Croix Valley that year. Operations are currently based out of the historic 1916 Soo Line depot, owned by the Osceola Historic Society and leased to the Minnesota Transportation Museum for its rail operations.				
	The route follows the <u>St. Croix River</u> valley on top of the river bluffs, slowly running down the grade to river level, crossing into <u>Minnesota</u> on the 1887 iron bridge at Cedar Bend, then on to <u>Marine on St. Croix</u> and back up the valley through <u>William</u> <u>O'Brien State Park</u> .

Railroader's Cook-off Competition	We are looking for the best Railroader's Cook-off by a Troop. Safari-themed Challenge Championship (campfire program)	Your troop / crew / team is encouraged to do a skit or song at the Saturday night Safari-themed Challenge Championship. Please have your skit approved by host Troop 589 by noon on Saturday.
First Aid	Please have the proper medical forms and permission slips handy for every Scout when you check in. The medical form is found on the camporee resources page <u>www.lmdbsa.org/tibe</u> . The first aid station will be located in Swanson Lodge.
Boy Scout Medical	The BSA medical form is available on the camporee registration page of the website. <u>www.lmdbsa.org/tibe</u>
Webelos Medical	The BSA medical form is available on the camporee registration page of the website www.lmdbsa.org/tibe .
Tent Camping Jamboree Style	Troops will be placed in area around Swanson Lodge. Due to space limitations, Troops should plan to camp 'Jamboree Style', with a minimal distance between tents and a central cooking area shared by the Troop.
Camp Fires	Open fires will be limited to existing fire rings only. Due to Jamboree style camping no ground fires/ Dutch oven cooking will be allowed outside of designated campfire areas. Plan to cook your meals using portable gas stoves within your campsite.
Water	Water is available next to and around Swanson. There are also several frost hydrants that are on year around.
Uniforms	Scouts and adult leaders should be in field uniforms (class A) for Saturday events and activities, when traveling back and forth from campsites, and on the train ride. Keep in mind that we are representing the BSA and we are expected to dress sharp.
Bring	 Bring your tents, sleeping bag, cookware, stoves, plates, cups, silverware, walking shoes, work gloves, and dress for the weather.
	 Bring your recipes, ingredients, and any cooking equipment for the Railroader's cooking competition. See 'Railroader's Cooking Competition' above for additional information.
Parking	Parking for your vehicle and trailer is available. Vehicles must be parked in one of the parking areas. The map can be found on the found on the camporee resources page www.lmdbsa.org/tibe .
Food Shelf Project	The Order of the Arrow is collecting non-perishable food to be transported to a local food shelf. Please turn your food items in at check-in.
Service Project	There will be a short service project for you to complete while at Camporee. Remember to bring your gloves.

- **Campground** Please be respectful of the other campers and please try to stay in the area assigned to Lake Minnetonka District.
- **Camporee Patch** Attendees will receive a Fall Camporee 2016 patch shown below. In the event that we run out of patches, first priority will be given to the members of Lake Minnetonka District.



Camporee Policies

The following rules were made to help us have a successful and safe camping experience. It is the responsibility of the adults in charge to see that Scouts know and understand these rules. Anyone violating them may be asked to leave the event.

Behavior: Scout Oath and Scout Law – applies to all Scouts and Scouters. Please emphasize the "good sport" and "do your best" aspects of Scouting. First and foremost, we're here to have fun.

Vehicles: Speed limit is 10 mph. No passengers in back of truck or trailer. Vehicles are limited to main roads and parking areas only. For information regarding parking, please see the section above titled 'Parking'.

Firearms: Personal firearms, ammunition (live or expended), explosives, fireworks and toy weaponry are prohibited.

Knives: NO straight-bladed knives are allowed in camp. Must follow BSA guidelines.

Lights out: Scouts are not allowed out of their site after lights-out with the exception of toand-from the latrines. Please respect others during lights-out. Scouters are asked to bring roaming Scouts to the headquarters after lights-out.

Radios: No radios. Use of electronics should be kept to a minimum.

Registration of Units Outside of Lake Minnetonka District: Registration is open to units outside Lake Minnetonka District. Registration closes for all units on October 12, 2016 at 11:55pm.

Refund Policy: Refunds will be made prior to registration closing and at the discretion of the event chairman.

All entries must be Railroad in theme, so anything from a 1-pot/hobo dinner to a dining-car multi-course meal. These meals can be cooked anyway desired as long as at least part of the entry is cooked with the use of charcoal (as we all know the original trains ran on coal.) Each entry must include an explanation of how it fits the theme and the better the story, the more style points awarded.

Each entry must also be cooked onsite by Scouts and presented on-time to the judging table. Entries will be reviewed at 6pm sharp as trains have schedules to keep! For every 5 min increment late, the entry score will be docked 5 points. Here is how the judges will score each entry:

- 1. Plate Presentation
- a. Overall Taste (flavor): ____/ 25
 b. Texture: * ___/ 20
 c. Presentation: ** ___/ 20
 2. Scout Presentation

 a. Clean hands: ____/ 5
 b. Pride/Scout Spirit:*** ___/ 5
