You must pick up your Valleyfair admission by 2:00PM on Saturday at the Valleyfair Admissions building, windows 11-13. If you are late, call Scott Janke at 952-220-2250.

Check-in

Friday Night Campout - Pre-registration is mandatory through the online registration process. No on-site registration is available.

One adult leader (i.e., Scoutmaster) and one youth leader (i.e., SPL) should check-in your entire unit at one time.

At check-in, you will be asked to provide:

- The Unit Attendance Form (attached to this Informational Packet) with the names of all Scouts and adults planning to participate in the program and your patrols.
- All medical forms for each Scout must be kept on-site, secure, and accessible.
- o **A list and time of visitors** (non-Scouters) attending camp.
- o The time you plan to check out so we can inspect your camp.

Once you have been checked-in, you will receive a large envelope with further directions, an updated schedule of events, map of the camp, **your park admission tickets** (you do not have to pick up your tickets at the Valleyfair Admissions building if you camp overnight), and your camporee patches. A camp host will take you to your designated camping area.

Every effort will be made to assign your unit to a campsite appropriate for the size of your unit. We ask that you set up your campsite in the area designated for you.

Saturday Attendance Only - Pre-registration is mandatory through the online registration process. No on-site registration is available. Parking

FRIDAY NIGHT

Parking for your vehicle and trailer is available across from the campsite without charge. You may leave the car parked until Saturday night without charge. Any vehicle that pulls out of the the campsite parking area into the main lot is subject to regular parking fees. No vehicles other than those associated with the overnight camping on Friday should be parked in the camping area. You are not to move your vehicle once it is parked.

Saturday only attendees will have to park in the main lot and pay \$17.00, or buy parking online in advance for \$12.99 using the link provided below.

Who would have thought you can go to an amusement park and get a Scouting award? The STEM/NOVA activities will focus around the various engineering Nova Awards:

- SWING! for Cub Scouts http://meritbadge.org/wiki/index.php/Swing%21
- WHOOSH! for Boy Scouts http://meritbadge.org/wiki/index.php/Whoosh%21
- HANG ON! for Venturing http://meritbadge.org/wiki/index.php/Hang_On%21



We will <u>not</u> be working on the adventure, the merit badges, or exploration requirements (requirement 2) for the awards so Scouts will need to complete those on their own. We will have videos for the reading/video requirements though I would expect given the opportunity to ride roller coasters or watch videos, many scouts will choose the coasters, so participants may want to do some of those (requirement 1) before hand as well. We will have activities on Friday night and Saturday morning for those that campout and then more activities in the park on Saturday for those coming for just the day. Please bring a printed copy of the appropriate workbook (from the links above) for the Nova award that you would like to work on. Sorry, Tiger and Lion Cubs are not eligible to participate in STEM/NOVA program (BSA rules, not ours).

Tent Camping Jamboree Style

Troops will be placed in camping area by the host troop. Due to the space limitations, Troops should plan to camp 'Jamboree Style', with a minimal distance between tents and a central cooking area shared by the Troop.

Camp Fires

FIRES and COOKING - NO WOOD FIRES

- Keep the fires small and contained.
- Extinguish all fires by pouring water on them, stirring the ashes, then applying more water. Repeat as often as needed.
- Ashes should be cool to the touch before you leave the site.
- Do not attempt to burn plastic, cans or foil.
- o If you do burn something that's not fully consumed, collect the remains when the fire is out and either pack it out or put it in a trash receptacle.
- Maintenance will supply a metal barrel to deposit hot coals/ashes

Water

Water is available at the camping area next to Headquarters and the location is marked.

Uniforms

Scouts and adult leaders should be in field uniforms (class A) while traveling and while at the camp on Friday night. However, on Saturday, Scouts may wear their (class B) T shirts. Keep in mind that we are representing the BSA and we are expected to dress sharp.

Bring

Bring your tents, sleeping bag, cookware, stoves, plates, cups, silverware, walking shoes, and dress for the weather.

Campground

Please be respectful of the camping area and all trash must be packed out.

Camporee Policies

The following rules were made to help us have a successful and safe camping experience. It is the responsibility of the adults in charge to see that Scouts know and understand these rules. Anyone violating them may be asked to leave the event.

Behavior: Scout Oath and Scout Law – applies to all Scouts and Scouters. Please emphasize the "good sport" and "do your best" aspects of Scouting. First and foremost, we're here to have fun.

Vehicles: Speed limit is 10 mph. No passengers in back of truck or trailer. Vehicles are limited to main roads and parking areas only. For information regarding parking, please see the section above titled 'Parking'.

Firearms: Personal firearms, ammunition (live or expended), explosives, fireworks and toy weaponry are prohibited.

Knives: NO straight-bladed knives are allowed in camp. Must follow BSA guidelines. No knives will be allowed in the park.

Lights out: Scouts are not allowed out of their site after lights-out with the exception of toand-from the latrines. Please respect others during lights-out. Scouters are asked to bring roaming Scouts to the headquarters after lights-out.

Radios: No radios. Use of electronics should be kept to a minimum.

Registration of Units Outside of Lake Minnetonka District: Registration is open to units outside Lake Minnetonka District.

Refund Policy: Refunds will be made prior to registration closing and at the discretion of the event chairman.
